

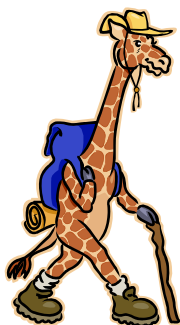

Because Air Activities is a Scouting initiative, their programs are priced from \$49 per person, representing the best value for money to experience real flying. Contact the base for more details.

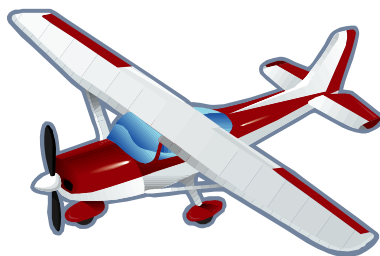

A bushwalking qualification is required for all bushwalking activities and **MUST** be held by the leader of the walk (including youth members undertaking Queen's Scout Expeditions and Green Cord hikes)

All members of the Movement are encouraged to have first aid skills. One of the best and cheapest ways to achieve this is to do a first aid course run by our Region Office. The team is from St. John Ambulance Australia. The region also has a team of volunteers who attend major activities.

Who can do it?

Senior First Aid courses are available for all uniformed and non-uniformed members of Scouts. This is a WorkCover approved course.

Participants of these courses must be 15 years and over.

When can I do this?

Radio & Science is a perfect opportunity to incorporate activities into the youth program and award scheme. The principle Radio scouting events are Jamboree of the Air (JOTA) and Jamboree on the Internet (JOTI).

Who can do it?

Radio & Science is available to all members of the scouting movement and everyone is welcome and encouraged to participate in JOTA/JOTI.

When can I do this?

JOTA/JOTI is held on the third full weekend in October each year.

Jamboree of the Air & Jamboree on the Internet

These world wide Scouting events attract well over a million participants each year. Making it the largest single event on the scout calendar. It is also the only international event in which all sections take part simultaneously.

JOTA makes use of local amateur radio operators to provide two way radio communication with other Scout and Guide groups throughout the world.

JOTI uses the internet and various communication technologies such as websites, email, instant messaging, internet relay chat, video and more. The primary chat network for Scouts (JOTI) is SCOUTLINK. This is a special worldwide chat network run by Scouts for Scouts.

Who can do it?

Abseiling is available for all members of the movement in some form. For example, Cubs may abseil up to 8m, Scouts 15m, whilst Venturers, Rovers and Leaders are only restricted by skills and experience. Joeys may undertake abseiling activities that do not involve a vertical drop and meet prescribed procedure.



When can I do this? All year round, meeting nights, day trips, weekends. The team runs a number of calendared Basic Rock Skills, Abseiling and Abseil Recovery courses each year, but are also happy to arrange alternate dates for your Pack, Troop, Unit or even Group Committee if the need arises!

Qualifications required

Activity must be under the control of an abseil instructor OR where participants have a general Basic Abseiler qualification, an Abseil Leader. Please refer to the NSW Branch Rockcraft (Abseil) policy for more information.

Courses Prerequisites

Abseiler Hold the Basic Rock Skills qualification.

Abseil Leader You must have an Abseiler qualification and a current Senior (or above) First Aid Certificate and be assessed by two instructors to have the technical skills and be of suitable maturity. You must also assist on a least one Basic Abseiling course in a leader role to complete the qualification.

Abseil Instructor The nominee instructor will either hold formal Training Competency or competency as determined by evidence and a peer review and must hold a current Senior (or above) First Aid Certificate.

Course Dates & Costs

Please see Bulletin notices, Region website, or Region Office.

Applications and course fee must be at Region Office no later than two (2) weeks prior to the course start date.

Rockcraft - Canyoning

If you are keen for some outdoor adventure and love the bush, then Canyoning is for you. Canyoning is a traverse through a river canyon. Basic Canyoning can be 'walk-in, walk-out' with more advanced canyons involving swimming, abseiling, or climbing.

Who can do it?

Scouts, Venturers, Rovers, and Leaders. The Canyoning Team heads off several times a year on a weekend away in the Blue Mountains and teaches people the skills and knowledge required for safe Canyoning.

When can I do this?

Late spring to early autumn depending on conditions. Day trips, weekends.

Qualifications Required

Activity must be under the control of a Canyoning Instructor. The Canyoning Team is also more than happy to provide your Group with an Instructor or two to attend your own Canyoning expedition if you do not hold appropriate qualifications.

Course Prerequisites

The Canyoning Team can instruct people to three levels: Canyoner (Basic) - allowing certificate holders to participate in other rock-based activities, Canyon Leader and Canyon Instructor.

Canyoner (Basic) This level requires a current Rockcraft (Basic) qualification and the ability to swim and stay afloat for 5 minutes dressed in a jumper, shorts and sandals before you can safely participate in this activity.

Canyon Leader This level requires both an Abseil Leaders qualification a Canyoner (Basic) qualification and a current First Aid Certificate (senior level or above) before you can participate in this advanced level of training.

Course Dates & Costs

Please see Bulletin notices, Region website, or Region Office. Applications and course fee must be at Region Office no later than two (2) weeks prior to the course start date.

For those who love the thrill of underground adventures, Caving is the activity for you! Caving is the sport of exploring naturally formed caves, above and below ground, both horizontal (walked or crawled through) and vertical (involving abseiling and ladder climbing).

Who can do it? Caving varies in degree of difficulty and is available to all members of the movement from 8 years of age. It is most popular in the Venturer and Rover sections.

When can I do this? All year round, day trips, weekends.

Qualifications required

Activity must be under the control of a Caving Instructor.

Course Prerequisites

Caver (Basic) This level requires a current Rockcraft (Basic) certification to participate in these weekend trips.

Caving Leader This level requires a current Abseil Leader, a Caver (Basic) qualification and a current First Aid Certificate (senior level or above)

Caving Instructor Those people interested in this level of qualification should contact the Caving coordinator (see below)

Rockcraft - Rockclimbing

So you have abseiled down a cliff-face. How do you get back up? Well, one alternative would be to climb and Rockclimbing lets you do just that. For a weekend, the Rockclimbing team can take you to the Blue Mountains and show you all the tricks and skills you need to be a confident rock climber. Forget the Indoor Climbing Gyms, this is real climbing at its best!



Who can do it?

Climbing in various settings and conditions is available to all members of the Movement over the age of 8, through commercial climbing gyms, day activities and weekend trips.

When can I do this?

All year round, meeting nights, day trips, weekends.

Qualifications Required

For commercial climbing gyms no qualification is required by the Scout Association. Outside Climbing activities must be under the control of a Rockclimbing Instructor or (where participants have a general Rockclimbing qualification) a Rockclimbing Leader.

Courses

The Rockclimbing Team can instruct people to three levels: Climber (Basic) - allowing certificate holders to participate in other rock-based activities, Climbing Leader and Climbing Instructor.

Rockclimber (Basic) This level requires a current Rockcraft (Basic) qualification to participate in this activity.

Rockclimbing Leader This level requires a current Abseil Leader, Rock climber (Basic) qualification and a current First Aid Certificate (senior level or above)

Please see Bulletin notices, Region website, or Region Office. Applications and course fee must be at Region Office no later than two (2) weeks prior to the course start date.

The Water Activities Team can help all Groups and Sections with water-based activities ranging from familiarisation days to course qualifications and adventure trips away. Water Activities include canoeing, kayaking, sailing, dinghy's and power boating including water skiing. The team are happy to go to group activities and will run courses for them.

Who can do it?

Canoeing is available to all members, with specific requirements applied to the Joey section. Please refer to the NSW Branch Water Activities Policy (Schedule A).

When can I do this?

Most suitable during spring to early autumn, day trips and weekends

Courses

Courses are usually run over 2 days with your choice of location for flat water. Courses are led by a Qualified Instructor with help from persons with Level 3 Qualifications.

A one day assessment may be made on production of a completed logbook.

The Region Water Team provides flat water canoeing courses that cater for everyone from Level 1 to Instructors. These courses are provided in two formats – just choose which one suits and interests you the best. As a prerequisite, all participants must be able to swim 50 metres.

Cub and Scout water activity badge courses may also be run throughout the year as required.

Water Activities - Sailing

Who can do it?

Sailing is available to all sections of the Movement. Specific requirements are defined for Joeys.

When can I do this?

Most suitable during spring to early autumn, day trips and weekends.

Courses

The Region Water Activities team run regular sailing courses on weekends throughout the year, as well as consecutive 5 day courses during the school holidays. Please refer to the NSW Branch Water Activities Policy (Schedule A).

These sailing courses are aimed at Scouts and Venturers (who should be accompanied by their Leaders). These courses aim to a Level 1 sailing qualification for all participants with some able to achieve Level 2 sailing qualification.

Region Commissioner (Activities)



Gang Show is two hours of live, fast-moving, musical comedy theatre for all the family. It's packed with loads of fun, fantastic sets and costumes and some wonderfully catchy songs and dances.

Gang Show is a \$100,000 plus production with a cast of 144 enthusiastic young people, a 20 piece orchestra, and around 250 behind the scenes. There are over 2000 costumes each year, and around 25 complete set changes every year.

Who can do it?

Cubs, Scouts, Venturers, Rovers and Leaders. Cast members need to be 10 years old as of the 1st July of the current season. Backstage members need to be 16 years old as of the 1st July of the current season.

When can I do this?

Auditions are usually held on the first Saturday in December for the following year's show.

Rehearsals are Saturday nights between March and July, 2 weekend camps, and full weekend rehearsals in the last month before the performances.

Backstage teams work throughout the year to prepare for the shows, contact the technical director (Peter Lee) for more information about what you can do to help.

Performances include 10 shows at the Parramatta Riverside Theatres, July school holidays each year. 2009 marks the 40th anniversary of the Cumberland Gang Show.

Activity Notification Procedures

Download A1 form from www.nsw.scouts.com.au

Activity Notification is a reporting process that helps to ensure the safety of our members. By sending notification to the appropriate people, information such as track closures, new developments, fire reduction exercises etc can be supplied to ensure your activity is a success.

Activity Notification applies to most activities outside the Scout Hall for all levels of the Movement.

The Branch Activity Notification Procedure has four key objectives:

1. Communication of activity information to parents
2. Provision of a reliable and effective mechanism for rescue/assistance, if required
3. Supply of timely and adequate information to Scout authorities, Police and other emergency services
4. Support for Activity Leaders, including access to local information and reminders of policies, procedures and other requirements. There are three forms (or parts) to record and distribute information which are available on the NSW Branch Website.

ACTIVITY NOTIFICATION FORM

PART I - PARTICIPANTS & PARENTS ADVICE

(THIS PAGE IS TO BE KEPT BY PARTICIPANTS)

Applies to all activities more than 2kms radius from the Scout Hall or overnight or Air/Alpine/Rock Related/Bushwalking/Water.

Information can include Maps, Gear Lists, Other Details, Region Course Details etc.

ACTIVITY PARTICIPATION AND MEDICAL FORM

PART II - PARTICIPANTS & PARENTS ADVICE

(TO BE COMPLETED AND RETURNED FOR ALL PARTICIPANTS)

This form records medical history of applicant and the leader medical authority in case of emergency.

ACTIVITY NOTIFICATION FORM

PART III - ACTIVITY & RESCUE INFORMATION

This form is used in case of emergencies and includes a list of participants, contact details, proposed routes, equipment required, qualifications of leader and lists the people who are to receive this form. This includes parents contact (home leader), Local Authority e.g. Police, Region Commissioner Activities at your Region, Regional Office in locality of activity or Local Area Coordinator.

Local Activity Coordinators (LAC) List

Activity notifications must be submitted for all outdoor overnight, and adventurous activities. Activity Notification Forms must be lodged 2 weeks before the event.
